	The following gear is for all Intermediates and Seniors for your comfort and safety while on your camping trips (12 years and up). All boys who have completed 8th grade need to bring hiking boots with ankle support, these should be broken-in before arriving at camp	
INSULATION / SHELL LAYERS		
1	Midweight Polartec Jacket, (Polartec fleece does not absorb moisture, dries quickly and is light weight, making it ideal for tripping).	
1	Waterproof Jacket with Hood, (Coated nylon works well and is reasonably priced. Ponchos are clumsy and don't protect well in wind).	
	Light Rain Pants in Nylon. (Pants should go on and off easily over boots, be breathable material and dry quickly).	
ESSENTIAL EXTRAS		
	Wool or Polartec Hat (for wind and rain, Ski hats work well)	
	A Closed Cell Foam Pad or Self Inflating Pad (for under your sleeping bag. This will protect you from moisture and cold coming from the ground).	
2	Pairs Mid-weight Boot Socks (wool or synthetic, but no cotton)	
2	Pairs of Sock Liners (for hiking and portaging. No cotton, since cotton does not dry quickly and contributes to blisters (current 8th graders and Canadian)	
2	Bandanas	
1	Collapsible Fishing Pole	
CANADIAN ONLY		
1	Pair of Boots for Portaging. (Teva sandal "hiker" is recommended for a PVC "unlined" rubber boot with a good lugged sole. Pick a shoe that drains and dries easily with a lugged sole and high top for ankle support).	
	Fishing Pole, A Small Packable Tackle Box (i.e. Piano-stowaway)	
1	Pair of Polartec or Wool Mittens or Gloves	
	Head Net for Mosquitoes (for additional comfort)	
	A Journal that you can write in for your trip	
	Sunglasses	
1	Billed Hat for wearing under rain jacket hood	
1	Polypropolene Long Underwear Top & Bottom Set
